

Guest Tour - Denmark Without A Passport

Elkhorn, Iowa Wednesday, September 3rd, 8AM-4:30PM

Velkommen to the 2014 Guest Tour at the Danish Village in Elk Horn!

We will begin with a guided tour of the historical 1848 **Danish Windmill**, an authentic windmill built in Denmark in 1848 and imported to Elkhorn and reassembled in 1976. The windmill boasts the largest Danish import gift shop in the USA! Guests will then visit the **Bedstemor's House**, an authentic Danish home that has been restored to its original 1908 Victorian period and is on the National Register of Historic Places. At the **Museum of Danish America** where we will experience the journey of a Danish immigrant from Denmark to the United States. Explore the rich heritage of Danish Americans with the museum's 35,000 + artifacts.



After lunch, guests will have the opportunity to visit **local specialty shops** including the Egg Krate Antique Store, Vin Haus, Daisy Girl Bath & Body and Fagen Lumber & Gift Shop. Wind down the day at the **Danish Countryside Vines & Wines Farm**, a completely renovated European style barn . Learn about wine making and viticulture practices, taste local wines, browse unique items at the gift shop and relax on the balcony overlooking the vineyards.

The guest tour will be \$25 or free with a paid 2-day guest registration. This fee covers transportation, lunch and all related fees. Vans will leave the hotel at 8AM sharp so please be near the front entrance of the hotel lobby by 7:50 AM. The tour will return to the hotel by 4:30PM. Children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. The tour will be limited to the first 25 registered. Registration in advance is required. Please note, the Iowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship is only able to pay expenses (hotel stay & conference registration) for commissioners and assistants attending the conference. If a commissioner or assistant would like to attend the guest tour rather than the conference they will have to incur the expenses.
