The 500 locally elected soil and water conservation district commissioners – five commissioners for each soil and water conservation district in Iowa, who serve without salary – comprise the Conservation Districts of Iowa's (CDI) membership. CDI's day-to-day operations are governed by an Executive Board and nine Regional Directors. The CDI Regional Directors each represent 9-13 counties.

Each district's local work is supported by the dedicated staff at CDI's office in Des Moines, led by the Executive Director who – coordinating with CDI partners – is responsible for oversight of programs and policies that impact Iowa's agricultural environment. Prizes are awarded at all grade levels.

Envirothon >>>


Each year, CDI supports regional and state-wide Envirothon competitions, a natural science-based competition for Iowa high school teams. Envirothon helps students cultivate a desire to learn more about our natural resources through competitive events. Teams take an indepth look at wildlife, aquatic ecology, forestry, soils/land use, and current environmental issues that affect our natural resources. CDI sponsors the state champions' trip to the national competition.

Public Policy >>>

CDI supports our districts and commissioners by working at the state and national level to make changes to agricultural and conservation policy. The best way to guide local control of land issues is through government policies that balance current science with the need for economic security and prosperity for communities and landowners. CDI works in the trenches to advocate for passage of sound conservation government policy.

Field Days >>>

Farmers have questions. Local CDI-sponsored Field Days offer answers. Farmers want fields rich with healthy soil, water systems that drain free of harmful chemicals, and land passed to the next generation in better condition than when they first put plow to plain. But to accomplish this, they deserve a profitable return on their investment. Field Days demonstrate real-world sustainability processes that educate and motivate.
